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COMMUNITY WATCH CAMPAIGN SUCCEEDS, \$60,000 FUNDING GOAL ACHIEVED

According to Tom Schnurr, Foundation President, "We're pleased we've been able to achieve our funding objective this quickly. With funding secured, the Moraga Police Department will now be able to install video systems at the Town's four remaining high traffic entrance locations.
